

Missed Connections by Robert W. McMaster

Why do we still go to the theatre?

One common view holds that theatre is about human connections—that we go to be reminded of the things that hold us together (or the things that keep us apart). But in the early months of 2013, we are seemingly more connected to more humans than at any other time in history. Facebook, Twitter, Foursquare, Tumblr, Instagram, Pintrest. Email, IM, text, cell, FaceTime. We know what our friends (and our "friends") had for breakfast, what their dog had for breakfast, and where they got the organic eggs and cruelty-free artisanal bacon. We find instant gratification on any question, without the need to put on clothes: Google, Wikipedia, eBay, Yelp, TripAdvisor, Expedia. Whether it's an anonymous fling or a life-long soul-mate, we can even find love (or a reasonable facsimile) through technology: craigslist, Adult FriendFinder, Grindr, Match.com, eHarmony, ChristianMingle.

All these tools are supposed to make human connection simple. They promise to make relationships as easy as ordering shoes.

Mostly, they fail.

But #hero is not a play about the evils of social networking; nor about the dangers of celebrity; nor about the rise and fall of modern heroes in the 24/7 news machine. In fact, there are no villains here. A villain, like a hero, is an easy thing, "a clear and simple fairy tale."

#hero is a story of connection. Two people, married to each other but alone and desperate to feel some sense of belonging. A third, who has built a life around manipulating that desire. All three, crashing into each other in different ways, but running blindly in the direction they hope will get them closer to one another. #hero is about that need, where it comes from, and the ways we all try to fill it.

It is not simple. Often, we fail.

But the struggle to find that connection is worth it. So we try again. Some of us sign up for another online dating service. Some of us update our status. Some of us order shoes.

Some of us go to the theatre.

Building on what we learned, we started our first full-length project with a dare as well:

"We fight about the little things, so we can ignore the big things."

Over a year and a half, we developed that idea in the rehearsal hall, incorporating the voice of every member of our company. We also put the work in front of our community, showing you parts of the work as it progressed at each *Dare Project*—and adding your feedback into the story at every chance.
