

The Dare Project began in April 2006 when three members of taxdeductible theatre stumbled upon a method of inspiring new work: dare the writer.

That night, over shots of tequila, they each dared another to write a ten-minute play. They were free to write whatever they liked, so long as it was true to the dare. Two months later, these three plays were presented as the first *Dare Project*.

Ten years later we are still here, celebrating more than 120 world premiere plays, developed in collaboration with over 200 contributors, and creating world-premiere works by more than 40 new playwrights.

Here's how it works: Our community *dares* us to write a tenminute play. The dare can be anything—a genre, a line of dialogue, a character—as long as it challenges us. Once dared, we take a month to develop our scripts, and then another month to give it life in a rehearsal hall. Finally, ready or not, the play is presented in front of a packed house as a one-night-only event.

Working this way is risky, it's bold, it's daring... and it's not always perfect. But it is worth a shot.



taxdeductible theatre uses the techniques discovered in *The Dare Project* to create new full-length plays developed in collaboration between writer, company and audience.

Our first full-length project was #hero, produced in March 2013. That play began at *The Dare Project*, when we developed five short plays all on the same dare: we fight about the little things, so we can ignore the big things. Over 18 months of work and continued development through *The Dare Project* laboratory, we gave our community an opportunity to see the work in progress. Through all of our collaborative efforts, that play may have been *written by* a single playwright, but it was certainly *authored by* all of taxdeductible theatre

We find new voices. We create memorable experiences. Most importantly, we challenge ourselves and our community to follow one basic rule: demand **bold** theatre
